OVERVIEW OF NDA

The National Development Agency (NDA) reports to Parliament through the Department of Social Development. The NDA is classified as a public entity under schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), and was established in November 1998 by the National Development Act, 1998 (Act No. 108 of 1998) (NDA Act) as government's response to the challenge of poverty and its causes in South Africa.

The NDA derives its mandate from the National Development Agency Act, 1988 (Act No. 108 of 1998). In terms of the Act, the primary objective of the NDA is to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to CSOs for the purposes of:

- (1) carrying out projects or programmes aimed at meeting the development needs of poor communities; and
- (2) strengthening the institutional capacity of other CSOs involved in direct service provision to poor communities.

(3) The secondary objects of the NDA in terms of the Act are- (a) to promote-

- (i) consultation, dialogue and sharing of development experience between CSOs and relevant organs of State; and
- (ii) debate on policy development
- (iii) to undertake research and publication aimed at providing the basis for development policy. A

(4) The NDA plays a critical role in contributing towards shifting the country from the scourge of poverty towards poverty eradication. Through the Act and various policies, the NDA contributes to – but is not limited to – the advancement of economic development, social cohesion, access to basic human rights and skills development. This contribution of the NDA supports the National Development Plan (NDP) 2030 outcomes for a greater and better South Africa.

1 BACKGROUND

The Agency currently operates offices in all nine (9) provinces, with its Head Office located in Parktown where the primary data centre is hosted. The NDA's ICT environment is centralised but provides ICT support and connectivity services to all provincial and district offices across the country. One of the NDA's critical ICT requirements is the availability of reliable internet services and secure interconnectivity of offices to enable efficient information sharing.

At present, the NDA utilises a converged Multiprotocol Label Switching (MPLS) network that connects all offices, including the Head Office. This MPLS solution enables each site to connect directly into the Current Service Provider's (CSP) telecommunications network and to access services from the CSP's core network.

The NDA has a total of twelve (12) offices (1 Head Office, 9 Provincial and 2 district Offices) interconnected via the MPLS network through fibre and/or wireless (LTE) connections. The organisation currently makes use of routers that are owned and managed by the network service providers. The NDA owns and manages its own Power-over-Ethernet (PoE) FortiGate switches (224D), which support fibre uplinks.

A centralised FortiGate - 401F is hosted at the service provider's premises and managed by the provider, while additional FortiGate Firewall devices (100F at the Head Office and 60F units at the Provincial and District Offices) are maintained internally by the NDA. Bandwidth capacities across offices currently range between 4Mbps and 10Mbps, with a central internet breakout of 20Mbps. District Offices connect via a 5G-enabled Access Point Name (APN) Point-to-Point configuration, using Huawei LTE routers in an office-based setup. In addition, the NDA operates a separate Voice over IP (VoIP) network through a different service provider. The current internet service provider has implemented routing rules to permit VoIP IP addresses per NDA office.

2 PURPOSE OF THE BID

The NDA seeks to transition from its traditional MPLS network to a more agile, scalable, and cost-effective Software-Defined Wide Area Network (SD-WAN) solution. This initiative will leverage internet-based technologies to securely interconnect the NDA's national footprint, enhancing operational efficiency and improving network resilience.

Scope of the Bid

The purpose of this bid is to appoint a qualified service provider to deliver the following services over a period of 60 months:

a) Provision, support, maintenance, and management of an SD-WAN solution

- Ensuring failover and high availability capabilities.
- Providing full central internet breakout for secure access.
- Enabling secure office interconnectivity across all NDA sites.

b) Provision, support, maintenance, and management of reliable internet services

- Ensuring high-performance connectivity with redundancy.
- Supporting the NDA's digital transformation and business continuity requirements.

The appointed service provider will be expected to deliver a secure, scalable, and future-ready network infrastructure that enables the NDA to meet its mandate effectively.

3 OBJECTIVES

The key objectives of this bid are to:

- a) Replace legacy MPLS infrastructure with a modern, cloud-optimised SD-WAN.
- b) Ensure high-speed fibre-based internet access at all NDA sites.
- c) Provide secure, resilient connectivity with LTE/wireless failover options.
- d) Enable centralised management and monitoring of WAN performance.
- e) Improve access to cloud-based services such as Microsoft Teams, Office 365, and Azure.

4 SCOPE OF WORK

4.1 SD-WAN Requirements

The service provider is required to design and implement a fully managed SD-WAN solution across all NDA offices that includes Dynamic path selection, WAN optimization, Application-aware routing, Integrated security features, and Failover and redundancy mechanisms (where applicable).

- 4.1.1 Primary Connection: Fibre-based Internet.
- 4.1.2 Failover (Secondary): 5G/LTE / Microwave Wireless.
- 4.1.3 Network architecture covering all sites as per the addresses on the table below.
- 4.1.4 Zero-touch provisioning and centralised policy control.
- 4.1.5 Enable segmentation for user groups, applications, and security zones.
- 4.1.6 Integration with Azure gateways (Cloud Optimisation).

4.2 Internet Connectivity

The service provider is required to provision, support, maintain, and manage internet connectivity with the following minimum standards:

4.2.1 Centralised Internet Breakout

- Provide 100 Mbps centralised internet breakout with a 100:100 local/international split.
- All traffic must route securely through the SD-WAN overlay.

4.2.2 SD-WAN Appliances

- Supply and configure enterprise-grade, SD-WAN-compatible routers (Fortinet or Cisco, or equivalent).
- Appliances must include firewall, VPN (IPSec/SSL), and application-aware routing capabilities.
- Provide minimum of 10 public IP addresses.

4.2.3 Bandwidth Requirements

- Minimum link speeds:
 - 20 Mbps for rural locations.
 - 100 Mbps for urban locations.
- Head Office (Parktown) must have a minimum of 100 Mbps fibre, scalable as demand grows.

4.2.4 Failover and High Availability

- Each fibre-connected site must include a **secondary connection** for failover (preferably LTE, microwave, or secondary fibre).
- Failover must be automatic and support session persistence.
- District offices with LTE-only connectivity must support 500 GB monthly data with monitoring and usage alerts.

4.2.5 Cloud Application Optimisation

- SD-WAN must provide direct cloud on-ramp optimisation for Microsoft Teams, Office 365, and Azure.
- Local peering or Azure Virtual WAN integration is preferred to ensure low-latency access.

4.3 Service Management Requirements

The service provider must ensure effective monitoring, management, and reporting of services through the following:

4.3.1 Reporting and Monitoring Portal

- Provide a web-based reporting portal/dashboard, accessible 24/7 to NDA.
- Portal must include:
 - Real-time link status.
 - Application performance analytics.
 - Bandwidth utilisation and usage trends.
- Bidders must provide a sample screenshot of the proposed portal.

4.3.2 Reports

- The solution must provide scheduled and on-demand reports, including at least:
 - Utilisation reports with graphs.
 - Link quality reports (latency, jitter, packet loss).
 - Bandwidth consumption by site/application.
- Bidders must attach three sample reports.

4.3.3 Scalability

- The solution must be scalable to allow bandwidth upgrades per site.
- Bandwidth requirements will be reviewed annually to align with NDA's digital transformation.

4.3.4 Service Level Agreement (SLA)

- SLA must clearly define performance parameters, uptime, response times, and penalties for non-performance.
- Penalty/rebate formula must be included in the bidder's submission.

4.3.5 Availability and Support

- The service must achieve 99% overall uptime across the NDA environment.
- 24/7/365 support with Tier 1–3 escalation.
- Real-time monitoring with proactive incident alerts.

4.3.6 Quality of Service (QoS)

- The solution must enable traffic prioritisation and shaping for voice, video, and data.
- Policies must be configurable to prioritise business-critical applications.

4.4 Security Requirements

The solution must incorporate enterprise-grade security controls that align with NDA's compliance obligations and protect all network traffic. The following requirements are mandatory:

4.4.1 Firewall Administration and Integration

- The bidder is expected to maintain and administer the FortiGate 401F firewall.
- The FortiGate 401F will be reused for the Head Office connection and must be located at the bidder's data centre.
- The bidder must provide their own enterprise firewall solution for service delivery.
- The NDA-provided FortiGate firewalls must be reflected in the proposed solution architecture and network diagram, but configuration responsibility remains with NDA.

4.4.2 Security Features

- The solution must provide a **secure private network** with:
 - Next-generation firewall (NGFW).
 - End-to-end encryption (IPSec/SSL).
 - Network segmentation between user, management, and guest traffic.
- Integrated firewall, anti-malware, intrusion detection/prevention (IDS/IPS), encryption, and Data Loss Prevention (DLP).
- POPIA-compliant data handling, including encryption of data in transit and at rest.
- Support for centralised firewall policy management across all sites.
- Deep Packet Inspection (DPI) to ensure application visibility and control.
- Built-in or integrated Secure Web Gateway (SWG) or support for a Secure Access Service Edge (SASE) framework.

4.4.3 Authentication & Access Control

- The solution must support a proxy-based architecture, where devices/users must authenticate before accessing NDA systems.
- Integration with NDA's Active Directory/LDAP (or equivalent) is required for centralised identity and access management (Where necessary).
- Wi-Fi access points must be supported with WPA3 enterprise-grade security, and optional guest Wi-Fi segregation.

4.4.4 Network Segmentation & Visibility

- The solution must enable traffic segmentation (e.g., user, management, and guest networks).
- Centralised logging, monitoring, and alerting for all firewall and security events must be included.
- Logs must be exportable to NDA's SIEM (if required).

4.4.5 Compliance and Governance

- Solution must ensure compliance with:
 - POPIA (Protection of Personal Information Act).
 - Industry-standard data privacy and security regulations.
- The bidder must provide quarterly security reports and participate in NDA's security review process.

5 TECHNICAL EVALUATION

The following criteria will be used: After the closing date for the bid invitation, an appointed evaluation committee of NDA officials will evaluate the proposals.

A minimum threshold of **80 points** should be obtained to qualify for the second phase of evaluation "Commercial Evaluation".

The committee will evaluate each of the bid proposals received against the Technical/Functional criteria as stated below:

6 COMMERCIAL EVALUATION

(a) Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the NDA's Supply Chain Management Policy and Preferential Procurement Policy, 2023, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis).

(b) Bid proposals received will be evaluated in Three (3) phases, namely **Phase 1: SCM administrative compliance**, **Phase 2: functionality**, and **Phase 3: evaluation in accordance with the 80/20 preference point system**.

(c) Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Third phase, a bid proposal scoring less than eighty (80) out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.

(d) Phase Three: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the second phase of the evaluation will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis), 10 points will be awarded for Enterprises owned by black people, 4 points for enterprise located in Gauteng Province, 2 points for Enterprises owned by black African women, 2 points for Enterprises owned by black African youth and 2 points for Black African with disability. The CSD I AM register report will be used to allocate points and the (80/20 system) will be applied in accordance with the table below:

(e) The highest ranked bidder will be awarded the bid. It should be noted also that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any service provider, and no service provider will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

7 JOINT VENTURES, CONSORTIUMS, TRUSTS, PARTNERSHIP OR ANY FORM OF AGREEMENT

- a) A joint venture, consortium, trust, partnership or any form of agreement will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- b) A joint venture, consortium, trust, partnership or any form of agreement will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity if the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- c) Bidders must submit concrete proof of the existence of a joint venture, consortium, trust, partnership or any form of agreement. The NDA will accept signed agreements as acceptable proof of the existence of a joint venture and/or consortium arrangement.
- d) When bidding through a Joint Venture, the Joint Ventures must submit a Consolidated B-BBEE certificate if it is not an incorporated entity when responding to tenders. This means that the bidder will have to obtain a new B-BBEE certificate for the Joint Venture, which consolidates each participant's B-BBEE status level.

3.2.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
