

2. PURPOSE OF THE BID

The aim of this Terms of Reference is to request proposals for the Supply, Installation and Configuration of Disaster Recovery Site Hardware with a minimum of three (3) years standard support and maintenance warranty for the National Development Agency (NDA).

Specifications

The National Development Agency requires a tightly integrated, workload-optimised system architected to support on-demand IT infrastructure, private cloud, and mixed workloads. It must be configured to meet a range of business needs, and be easily and rapidly deployed to support a variety of virtualised application environments. As part of the NDA ICT best practices, compatibility and standardisation is compulsory.

Bidders to respond in the following way:

- Demonstrate both the ability and the proposed solution with respect to the element(s) concerned;
- Demonstrate the track record with respect to the element(s) concerned;
- Demonstrate compliance with the Agency's requirement.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The Supply, Installation and Configuration of Disaster Recovery Site Hardware with a minimum of three (3) years standard support and maintenance warranty for the National Development Agency (NDA) and should include the minimum specification as presented below:

3.2 Service Management Requirements:

- Installation and configuration of 2x SAN Switches at The Production Environment (Head Office).
- ii. Seeding of production virtual machines on the new equipment (for Disaster Recovery) procured to be done at Head Office.
- iii. Once the seeding is done the equipment must be moved to the Disaster Recovery Site in KZN, where it has to be installed.
- iv. Replication and failover must be configured and tested using VEEAM Backup and Replication software.

NB: Quotation should exclude VMWARE Esx & VEEAM licences, NDA has licenses.

3.3 Security Requirements:

The bidder is expected to be fully responsible for security logistics concerning the transportation of the equipment from the Production Site (Parktown, Head Office) and Disaster Recovery Site (KZN).

4 AD HOC SERVICES (NON SCORABLE REQUIREMENTS)

- 4.2 The Ad Hoc Services will not exceed 15% of the Contract Value for the contract period. Both the Agency and the successful bidder will be required to keep account of the Ad Hoc Services and the costs thereof, such that the specified variation percentage is not exceeded.
- 4.3 All service requests requirements will be classified as Ad Hoc Services, except for the Change Requests that result from Incident Management, Problem Management and Maintenance processes, which will be part of the baseline services.
- 4.3 The Successful bidder will invoice only on approved and completed Ad Hoc Services on one-month arrear bases. Bidder to indicate acceptance with this arrangement.
- 4.4 Ad hoc services to be agreed in advance with the successful bidder and price list to be documented in advance.

The bidder must provide a detailed work plan with activities and deliverables within the scope of work on how to implement the project.

- Installation and configuration of 2x SAN Switches at The Production Environment (Head Office) = 9 points
- Seeding of production virtual machines on the new equipment (for Disaster Recovery) procured to be done at Head Office =4 points
- Once the seeding is done the equipment must be moved to the Disaster Recovery Site in KZN, where it has to be installed =3 points
- Replication and failover must be configured and tested using VEEAM Backup and Replication software =9 points

Service Take-on (Project Plan) = Total of 5 points

The bidder must provide a detailed work plan with activities, timelines and deliverables within the scope of work on how to implement the project.

0 - 2 months = 5 points Above 2 months = 0 points

Experience and References = Total of 20 points

Bidders must submit the company profile with their experience documented in a maximum of two pages. Full five (5) points will be allocated to a bidder with two years of experience and above. Zero will be allocated to bidders with less than two years' experience.

Bidders will be allocated a zero, if they do not specify in writing the years of experience in the supply, installation and configuration of Disaster Recovery Site.

Bidders must submit a curriculum vitae(s) of their Support Specialists. Full six (6) points will be allocated to a bidder with a Support Specialist with a minimum of five (5) years' experience and relevant certifications. Less than five (5) years' experience with no relevant certifications will score a zero.

Bidders must provide three (3) reference letters submitted. Written references from bidders' clients should detail the nature of work done, duration of contract and it should be on the referee's official letterhead with full contact details and designation of the person signing the reference letter. Each reference letter will score **three (3) points**. Failure to provide a letter with these details will result in a score of zero (0).

Note: Only one copy of the bid document is required by the NDA. Bidders must keep their own copy of the bid document submitted to the NDA as no copies will be made for any bidder by the NDA.

6 COMMERCIAL EVALUATION (PHASE 2)

- 6.1 Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.
- The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase bids will be evaluated on functionality and on the second phase in accordance with the 80/20 preference points system respectively.
- 6.3 Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points or more out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 80 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- In order to claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 6.6 Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.
- 6.7 Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1) in order to claim preference points.
- A tender will be awarded to the tenderer who scored the highest total number of points in terms of the preference point systems (price and B-BBEE points). It should be noted that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any bidder and no bidder will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

7 PRICING

- 7.1 Bidders must submit a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g.
 Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT
- 7.2 Bidders must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be clearly indicated.
- 7.3 Bidders must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted.
- 7.4 Bidders will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a dully authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally

appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.

7.5 All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen, proposals written in pencil will not be accepted and evaluated.

7.6 A two-envelope system will be used for the submission of proposals.

8 TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from the closing date of this bid.

9 NDA PAYMENT TERMS

The NDA will accept and process Invoices form the supplier once installation has been completed and certified to be in good working order. Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission and approval.

10 MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

10.1 Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS). Where consortium/joint ventures/sub-contractor are involved each party to the association must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate or SARS tax Pin or a CSD report.

10.2 Company registration documents (CIPC).

10.3 A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.

All participating bidders must complete, sign and return ALL the attached SBD forms (SBD1, SBD2, SBD4, SBD6.1 SBD 6.2, SBD8 and SBD9) declaration forms, together with their proposals.

Failure to complete and submit any of the attached documents will result in immediate disqualification.

12 CONTRACT AWARD

A binding contract will be signed after both parties have fully agreed to the scope of work and all terms and conditions. The NDA legal department will develop a draft contract that shall be used as basis to finalise contract terms and conditions.

13 DISCLAIMER

- Whilst all due care has been taken in connection with the preparation of this bid, the NDA makes no representations or warranties that the content in this bid or any information communicated to or provided to bidders during the bidding process is, or will be, accurate, current or complete. The NDA, and its officers and employees will not be liable with respect to any information communicated which is not accurate, current or complete.
- 13.2 If a bidder finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in the bid or any other information provided by the NDA (other than minor clerical matters); the bidder must promptly notify NDA in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford the NDA an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).

- 13.3 Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by the NDA will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all bidders without attribution to the bidder who provided the written notice.
- 13.4 No representations made by or on behalf of NDA in relation to this bid will be binding on the NDA unless that representation is expressly incorporated into the contract ultimately entered into between NDA and the successful bidder.

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
