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OVERVIEW OF NDA

The National development Agency is a public entity listed under Schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). It was established in terms of the National Development Agency Act No 108 of 1998 as amended.

In terms of the National Development Agency (NDA) Act (Act No 108 of 1998 as amended), NDA was mandated to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to civil society organizations (CSOs) to:

- Implement development projects in poor communities, and
- Strengthen the institutional capacity of other CSOs that provide services to poor communities.

Reduced levels of poverty in South Africa.

Mission:

A premier development agency that coordinates and integrates development initiatives to break the cycle of poverty in the country.

1. BACKGROUND

Schedule 4 of the Constitution identifies welfare services, population development and disaster management as functional areas of concurrent national and provincial legislative competence and these functional areas has been assigned to the National Department of Social Development.

Outcome 13 of the National Development Plan: An inclusive and responsive social protection system has also been assigned to the National Department of Social Development to be the lead and coordinating Department. In keeping with addressing the multi-dimensionality of poverty and inequality, in the South African context, social protection is an umbrella concept that brings together, amongst others:

Measures to address capability poverty: support to early childhood development and investments in children; labour market activation policies and measures that foster productive inclusion of the under-and unemployed;

- (a) Protective measures for nutritional and food security. It is becoming increasingly evident in a growing number of countries that income is central but often not enough to ensure access to adequate quantities of nutritious food and nutrients.
- (b) Developmental social service interventions to address (i) economic and social exclusion and strengthen social cohesion; (ii) ensure that families and individuals are able to access services, entitlements, and potential economic and social opportunities; and (iii) developmental social services to reach out and provide care to the vulnerable such as those affected by HIV, women & children abuse, disabled etc.

The NDA is part of a broader Social Development Sector, which the National Department of Social Development leads and therefore has a critical role to play towards the attainment of Outcome 13 more especially in ensuring that developmental services are accessed by poor communities;

The NDA act has assigned a specific mandate to the NDA is to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to civil society organizations for the purposes of:

- (a) Carrying out projects or programmes aimed at meeting development needs of poor communities; and
- (b) Strengthening the institutional capacity of civil society organizations involved in direct service provision to poor communities.

In the course of implementing its mandate, the NDA is often confronted with legal changes which requires specialized expert legal knowledge.

2. PURPOSE OF THE BID

The purpose of the bid is to solicit proposals from a suitable service provider to render the following required services to the NDA over a period of 36-months:

2.1. Specifications

Bidders to respond in the following way:

- Demonstrate both the ability and the required services within the set parameters and scope;
- Demonstrate the track record with respect to the services required concerned;
- Demonstrate compliance with the Agency's requirement

3. SCOPE OF WORK

3.1 The objectives of the NDA

The objective of the NDA in inviting responses to this request is to appoint suitably qualified and experienced service providers to deliver legal services to the NDA as specified in the tender specification.

Note: Bidders who score less than 80% on technical evaluation will not be evaluated further.

c. Clarification of the above Score System

Lead Attorney (Total mark = 25)

- Participating law firms must submit copies of court orders confirming the lead attorney's admittance as an attorney and proof of him practicing law for the past 8 years.
- Failure to submit such certification will result in a score of (0) for this section.

Legal Secretary (Total mark = 15 marks)

- The law firm must submit a copy of their legal secretary's qualifications as evidence of him/her being qualified as a legal secretary together with evidence of proof of 2 years working experience.
- Failure to submit such evidence will result in a score of (0) for this section.

Proof of Admittance as an Attorney (Court Order) (Total mark = 25)

- Participating law firms must submit copies of court orders confirming their team's admittance as attorneys.
- Failure to submit such certification will result in a score of (0) for this section.

References (Total mark = 20)

- References must be in writing, on the referee's letterhead, with the contactable details of the referee and must be signed by a duly authorized person. Any references provided in a different format will NOT be accepted and will be disqualified.
- The reference must provide; nature of project/work done, duration of project, project value and must confirm if the project was completed successfully. A copy of a Purchase Order will not be accepted as a reference.
- Should a service provider fail to submit the minimum number of the required references, they will score a (0) on this section.
- A full mark of (20) will only be obtained if the references provided meet all the requirements stipulated above.

NB: Contactable details refer to the official email address and phone number.

Note: Only one copy of the bid document is required by the NDA. Service providers must keep their own copy of the bid document submitted to the NDA as no copies will be made for any service provider by the NDA.

6. COMMERCIAL EVALUATION (PHASE 2)

- 6.1 Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.
- 6.2 The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase bids will be evaluated on functionality and on the second phase in accordance with the 80/20 preference points system respectively.
- 6.3 Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points or more out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 80 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- 6.4 Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid average cost per hour will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 6.5 In order to claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 6.6 Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.
- 6.7 Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1) in order to claim preference points.
- 6.8 A tender will be awarded to the tenderer who scored the highest total number of points in terms of the preference point systems (price and B-BBEE points). It should be noted that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any service provider and no service provider will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

7. PRICING

7.1 Service providers must submit a detailed cost breakdown (cost per hour) for all applicable costs e.g. Initial setup costs, monthly costs, and any other applicable costs. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT.

7.2 Service providers must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of

7.3 the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be clearly indicated.

7.4 Service Providers must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted.

7.5 Service providers will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a dully authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.

7.6 All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen, proposals written in pencil will not be accepted and evaluated.

7.7 A two envelope system will be used for the submission of proposals.

8. TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from the closing date of this bid.

9. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission and approval.

10. MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

10.1 Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS).Where consortium/joint ventures/sub-contractor are involved each party to the association must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate or SARS tax Pin or a CSD report.

10.2 Company registration documents (CIPC).

10.3 A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.

10.4 All participating Service Providers must complete, sign and return ALL the attached SBD forms (SBD1, SBD2, SBD4, SBD6.1, SBD8 and SBD9) declaration forms, together with their proposals. Failure to complete and submit any of the attached documents will result in immediate disqualification.

10.5 Fidelity Fund Certificate.

10.6 Registration with the Law Society or the Legal Practice Council- proof of the registration from the relevant law society or Legal Practice Council must be provided.

10.7 Proof of right of appearance in the high court (for litigation)

10.8 ID copies of partners/owners.

Failure to submit the above requirements with the bid document will lead to disqualification. There will be no disqualification for none submission of a BEE certificate/sworn affidavit but service providers who do not submit will be scored a zero.

11. CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

The NDA will not appoint any supplier who is not registered as a prospective supplier on the central supplier database as required in terms of National Treasury Circular No. 3 of 2015/2016 and National Treasury SCM Instruction note 4 of 2016/2017

12. CONTRACT AWARD

A binding contract will be signed after both parties have fully agreed to the scope of work and all terms and conditions. The NDA legal department will develop a draft contract that shall be used as basis to finalise contract terms and conditions.

13. DISCLAIMER

- 13.1 Whilst all due care has been taken in connection with the preparation of this bid, the NDA makes no representations or warranties that the content in this bid or any information communicated to or provided to bidders during the bidding process is, or will be, accurate, current or complete. The NDA, and its officers and employees will not be liable with respect to any information communicated which is not accurate, current or complete.
- 13.2 If a bidder finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in the bid or any other information provided by the NDA (other than minor clerical matters), the bidder must promptly notify NDA in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford the NDA an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- 13.3 Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by the NDA will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all bidders without attribution to the bidder who provided the written notice.

13.4 No representations made by or on behalf of NDA in relation to this bid will be binding on the NDA unless that representation is expressly incorporated into the contract ultimately entered into between NDA and the successful bidder.

14. ADDITIONS AND AMENDMENTS TO THE BID

14.1 The NDA reserves the right to change any information in, or to issue any addendum to this bid before the closing date and time. The NDA its officers and employees will not be liable in connection with either the exercise of, or failure to exercise this right.

14.2 If the NDA exercises its right to change information in terms of clause 14.1 all amendments will be communicated to all bidders.

6. The bidder has arrived at the accompanying bid independently from, and without consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor. However communication between partners in a joint venture or consortium³ will not be construed as collusive bidding.

7. In particular, without limiting the generality of paragraphs 6 above, there has been no consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor regarding:

- (a) prices;
- (b) geographical area where product or service will be rendered (market allocation)
- (c) methods, factors or formulas used to calculate prices;
- (d) the intention or decision to submit or not to submit, a bid;
- (e) the submission of a bid which does not meet the specifications and conditions of the bid; or
- (f) bidding with the intention not to win the bid.

8. In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the products or services to which this bid invitation relates.

9. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.

³ Joint venture or Consortium means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.

10. I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
